Rest Ye Merry, Gentlemen

A call for men and women to be of good courage

Welcome to Robinson Avenue on this cold December morning! We are so glad that you are here. If you are visiting with us today as we are especially glad that you are with and we pray that today will be a blessing to you. We also hope that you'll be encouraged to return and to continue to get to know our church family and to allow us the privilege to get to know you.

Our current sermon series is entitled A Redemption Carol. We are examining some themes from Charles Dicken's wonderful novel A Christmas Carol and comparing those to an even larger story of redemption found in the Bible. Today we will focus on living redeemed lives in the present.

Interestingly there is only one Christmas carol that is referenced in the novel A Christmas Carol and that is God Rest Ye Merry Gentleman. When you look closely at the first line of that classic song you'll notice that a comma is placed between the words "merry" and "gentlemen" – this comma often baffles those who notice it. We are accustomed to singing about merry gentlemen but in

the song "merry" is actually an adverb that modifies "rest" and not an adjective that modifies "gentlemen"! But what does the phrase "rest ye merry" even mean? You have to go back to old English to decipher the lyric. In those days "rest" could also mean "create" or make" and "merry" often meant "mighty". And so to paraphrase the first stanza of the hymn: "May God make you mighty! Don't be dismayed! Jesus has been born into the world that we might be saved from Satan's power. So be comforted and be joyful."

Jesus' birth was just the first chapter in the great story of redemption.
Jesus' birth signaled that God was putting a plan into motion to bring about the ultimate defeat of Satan.
Believe it or not – that tiny, vulnerable baby boy was the key to God's redemptive plan! God rest ye merry.

It's a great day to be alive and I am happy to be spending it here with each of you! I'm thankful for you and the chance we have to worship together.

Have you ever read through the Proverbs before? Bridgette and I read through them when we were still dating as part of a couple's bible study. We would look at the Proverbs together and talk about the ones that stuck out to us. Large parts of the book are made up of seemingly disjointed and unrelated fortune cookie-like sayings. At least that's how I initially perceived it. However, there is a common theme that brings them all together which can pretty much be summed up by Proverbs 1:7.

"The fear of the Lord is the beginning of knowledge, but fools despise wisdom and instruction."

I was a third-year bible major at Harding when I read this verse for the first time. I was taking 18 hours of bible related classes that were designed to increase my knowledge, but I still felt like it was meaningless at times. All the knowledge I was gaining seemed empty. It felt like I was learning purely for the sake of learning without a greater aim. Can you relate? Solomon, the author of parts of the Proverbs and the next book, Ecclesiastes, certainly could.

In Ecclesiastes 1:1-2, we get a clear picture of Solomon's attitude about his pursuits. He says, "'Meaningless! Meaningless,' says the teacher. 'Utterly meaningless! Everything is meaningless!" I'm not sure what you think about that, but I think it's a pretty bleak way of looking at things. He goes on to say "Look, I have increased in wisdom more than anyone who has ruled Jerusalem before me; I have experienced much of wisdom and knowledge. Then I applied myself to the understanding of wisdom, and also of madness and folly, but I learned that this, too, is chasing after the wind."

I've wondered about Solomon and why he had this sort of outlook. He was the wisest king to ever rule over Jerusalem. He was immensely intelligent, and he could do anything he wanted. Why then did he come to believe that it all was meaningless?

I want to take you back to Proverbs 1:7. "The fear of the Lord is the beginning of knowledge." Learning for the sake of learning will always feel empty and meaningless because the fear of the Lord isn't the foundation. As we worship today and learn, we have to have a respect and desire for God first. Otherwise, we are only here to fill a pew which is meaningless.
