Good morning everybody! We have a busy spring coming up and the summer will be here before we know it. Make sure you stay up to date with everything happening with the youth ministry through our group messages, Instagram, Facebook, or website.

This week I was reading and came across 1 Corinthians 5. Honestly, I normally wouldn't pay much attention to this chapter based on the title alone. Look it up. You'll see what I mean. However, there's some real wisdom in it that I would normally have missed that I wanted to share with you this morning. I am not sure if you can identify with the story I am about to tell, but the mindset I talk about is one that is very easy to fall into. I was a great example of it and still am at times.

I grew up in the church. My early ideas were deeply ingrained and also completely flawed and immature. When I looked at the church, I saw it as a group of people who were committed to living a life according to a moral teaching. This code was admirable and something that all people, both those in the church and outside of it, would be judged by. I believe these are still as true today as they were when I was forming my ideas. However, I drew this sharp dichotomy in my mind: Us vs. Them, the Church vs. the World, the Morally Superior vs. the Morally Inept. Naturally, I had to disassociate myself as much as possible or risk being corrupted. I knew I was supposed to try and help "those people" to come to my side, but that knowledge rarely resulted in any action. My heart was exactly the opposite of what it was supposed to be.

Maybe my story is one you have seen in yourself or in others before. Paul has something to say about it:

"I wrote to you in my letter not to associate with sexually immoral people – not at all meaning the people of this world who are immoral, or the greedy and swindlers, or idolaters. In that case you would have to leave this world. What business is it of mine to judge those outside the church."

Paul had it right. We shouldn't disassociate with those we may view as outside the church. If we did that, we would never be able to leave Robinson Avenue. What do we do with this then? Jesus liberally scattered seed everywhere and it was up to the soil it landed on to let the seed grow. This passage reminded me to do the same. We can't pick and choose or restrict our message to those in the church.
