I wanted to go ahead and let you know the dates for our upcoming summer events. They’ll be here before you know it and it’s never too early to start planning ahead.

We are on Chapters 5 & 6 of 2 Samuel this week. We have been covering the book of 2 Samuel during our Wednesday night class for LTC. It’s been a lot of fun so far and I hope you enjoy following along as well.

Quick review: King Saul has died and now the Kingdom of Israel has descended into civil war. On one side are those who are loyal to Saul’s son, Ish-bosheth, and on the other are those who are loyal to David. The war was raging on until Ish-bosheth and his top general, Abner, were assassinated. David mourned their deaths and now the question is what will happen to Israel and who will be its king.

Chapter 5 opens up on a war-torn country. David and the tribe of Judah have won and the elders of the other 11 tribes want peace. They come to David and anoint him king over all of Israel. At this moment, the monarchy has switched from Saul’s family to David’s. Israel is united once again under the leadership of one man. As a united nation, David leads Israel to Jerusalem in order to conquer it and make it his capital. God delivers the city to them and David settles in. King Hiram, a close trading partner, even decides to build David an extravagant palace as a “congratulations” gift. David has finally found rest from all the turmoil that surrounded his rise to power. Now he wants God to find a permanent home as well.

Chapter 6 is all about David’s desire to bring the Ark of the Covenant to Jerusalem. David has enjoyed a close relationship with God, but now he wants the “seat of God” to be with him as well. In the process of moving the Ark, God strikes down Uzzah and this rattles David. He no longer feels it is safe to have God come to Jerusalem and I don’t blame him. A few months go by and David decides to bring the Ark again. God will physically be with David and Israel by extension once again. He will have a place of honor. While this is going on, David dresses in the uniform of the High Priest which is significant. He makes sacrifices to God and mediates on behalf of the people. David is not only the King of Israel. He is also, at least for now, a priest of God. Can you think of anyone else who comes after David who is both King and High Priest? This foreshadows Jesus and the covenant between God and David which we will learn about next week!
