The importance of worshipping alone and together

Good morning! If you are a guest to Robinson Avenue this morning we are so glad that you are here. We're blessed each and every Sunday to meet new people — some are new to our area, others are just passing through, still others are here visiting family. Whatever it is that brings you here today we are, simply, thankful that you have joined us. Obviously you are here because you believe in the importance of assembling with Christians to worship God.

Over the last couple of months we have been learning about worship. Our primary focus has been on individual, private times of worship. These times are vital to our spiritual growth. One of the great private worshippers in the Bible was David. David composed many, many Psalms during times of solitude and reflection. Yet David also recognized the importance of gathering with other worshippers to praise God together. In the Psalms he says things like, "I will declare your name to my people; in the assembly I will praise you" and "With my mouth I will greatly extol the Lord; in the great throng of worshippers I will praise him." I hope that today we will grow together in our worship — and also grow closer to God. I pray that we will tune out every conflict and distraction so that our thoughts will be completely focused on our Creator and Sustainer. May God bless our time before His throne today!



Good morning folks! We are taking a look at 2 Samuel 9 and 10 this morning. I've said many times that many books in the Old Testament, 2 Samuel especially, are incredibly interesting. They honestly read like a script to a soap opera or an edge-ofyour-seat action flick. This week's chapters are no different.

Quick review: David is the king over all of Israel. Whatever he has done up to this point, God has been with him. God has brought David through wars and turmoil and we learned last week that God wants to do even more for him. God basically promises David that the Messiah will come from his family which is a big deal. The dust has settled, David is comfortable, and Chapter 9 opens up on David looking back and remembering what things were like before all this.

David's best friend was the son of King Saul, Jonathan. The scriptures tell us that David and Jonathan loved each other. Their bond was unlike any other and when Jonathan was killed, David wept over him. It's been years since Jonathan died and David wants to reach out to anyone he can show kindness to because of Jonathan's importance to him. David learns that Jonathan had a son named Mephibosheth (what a name!), and David brings him to Jerusalem. David invites Mephibosheth, one of the few remaining descendants of Saul, to become a member of his own house. Basically, Mephibosheth becomes like a son to David which I think is a great example of love and forgiveness triumphing over divisions.

Chapter 10 is a story of tragedy and war. A neighboring king dies and his son ascends to the throne. David sends the new king his condolences with some messengers. These men are mistaken as spies and humiliated and treated like POWs by the king. Realizing their mistake, the king hires mercenaries to fight against the eventual retaliation of David. The retaliation comes, Israel is surrounded by the king and his mercenaries, and yet Israel is still able to win the battle. God keeps coming up big for his people. God rescues those who follow him. I wonder what would happen if Israel no longer followed God. Check back next week to find out!
