Oct. 6 – Parent Meeting during morning class

Good morning everyone! Our annual parent meeting has been moved to Oct. 6 so please make a note of that. If you are the parent of 7th-12th grader who is planning on being involved in the youth ministry this year, please make an effort to be there. We will be looking at the upcoming calendar, taking care of paperwork, and talking about how things are going to be working this year. You won’t want to miss it!

“You are the salt of the earth. But if the salt loses its saltiness, how can it be made salty again? It is no longer good for anything, except to be thrown out and trampled underfoot. You are the light of the world. A town built on a hill cannot be hidden. Neither do people light a lamp and put it under a bowl. Instead they put it on its stand, and it gives light to everyone in the house. In the same way, let your light shine before others, that they may see your good deeds and glorify your Father in heaven.”

This morning in class we talked about salt and light and how Jesus compares us to them in Matthew 5.

Salt – It is a substance with almost infinite uses. Salt has been used for everything from cleaning to currency, flavoring to fire starting, and preserving to pest control. In its usefulness, salt is second only to duct tape. You can do anything with that stuff! When Jesus looks at a disciple, he sees people who are highly valuable. He see people who are incredibly useful. A dedicated disciple is Jesus’ tool of choice for working in the world. However, he warns us that we can become useless. In my opinion, we can lose our saltiness by either burning out, losing our zeal, or losing our focus. In class we talked about some things we can do to help.

1. Regular time alone with God
2. Find a support structure
3. Don’t do it alone
4. Pace yourself
5. Take care of yourself (physically, mentally, emotionally, spiritually)

Light – Jesus makes it very clear that we are a bright and shining light in the world. I think it is important to realize where the source of our light comes from. According to the last words of the passage above, who gets the glory for the good that we do? God gets the glory! God is the source of the light that we have. Like God, that light is bright and cannot be hidden even if we try and hide it. Addressing our the presence of our fear or pride, Jesus says “Let your light shine so that people may glorify your Father in heaven.”
